SAN FRANCISCO, CA—October 31, 2016—In their sixth season of free monthly dance performances in San Francisco City Hall's extraordinary rotunda, Dancers' Group and World Arts West continue their partnership to bring audiences lunchtime glimpses into movement and musical traditions from around the world.

This December, Bolivia Corazón de América closes the Rotunda Dance Series with an array of dances from the South American country of Bolivia, celebrating its diverse and rich culture. A mixture of traditional dances from the Andes high plateau, the valley, and the Amazon will culminate in one of Bolivia's most emblematic forms, the Cueca. Descended from Indian-American, African and Spanish roots, this courtship dance was born at the beginning of the nineteenth century and is widely popular today, and is danced on stages, in the streets, and on national and social occasions throughout the country.

The Series brings many of the Bay Area's most celebrated dance companies to San Francisco City Hall's rotunda space for free monthly noon-time performances. The Rotunda Dance series is presented by Dancers' Group and World Arts West in partnership with Grants for the Arts and San Francisco City Hall. Artists who will be presented during the 2017 Rotunda Dance Series will be announced shortly.
